This application for bail under Section 483 of BNSS has been filed by the petitioner who has been arrested in connection with FIR No.646/2023 registered at Police Station Hanumangarh Town, District Hanumangarh, for offences under Sections 420, 406, 120-B of IPC.

Heard learned counsel for the petitioner, learned Public Prosecutor as well as learned counsel for the complainant. Perused the material available on record.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the offences pressed against the petitioner are triable by court of Magistrate. He submits that the allegations pertain to the year 2014 and FIR has been registered after a delay of almost 9 years in the year 2023 and he has been arrested now. He further submits that the

matter pertains to property dispute. He submits that the main accused Salim Khan has been enlarged on by a co-ordinate Bench of this Court vide order dated 27.02.2024. Learned counsel submits that the petitioner is in judicial custody since 27.05.2026 and the trial of the case will take sufficiently long time, therefore, the benefit of bail may be granted to the accused-petitioner.

Per contra, learned Public Prosecutor as well as learned counsel for the complainant have opposed the bail application.

This court has considered the arguments raised by the learned counsel for the parties. The offences alleged to have been committed by the petitioner are triable by court of Magistrate and petitioner is behind the bars since 27.05.2026. Hence, keeping in view of the fact that conclusion of the trial of the case is likely to take time and the prosecution has not shown any apprehension of the petitioner fleeing away from justice, in case he is enlarged on bail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, I deem it just and proper to grant bail to the petitioner under Section 483 of BNSS.

Consequently, the bail application under Section 483 of BNSS is allowed. It is ordered that the accused-petitioner **Sohil Khan S/o Salim Khan**, arrested in connection with FIR No.646/2023 registered at Police Station Hanumangarh Town, District Hanumangarh, shall be released on bail, if not wanted in any other case, provided he furnishes a personal bond of Rs.50,000/- and two sureties of Rs.25,000/- each, to the satisfaction of learned trial court, for his appearance before that



court on each & every date of hearing and whenever called upon to do so till completion of the trial.
