Order

1. The applicants have filed the present bail applications under Section 483 of BNSS being aggrieved against the orders dated 02.06.2026, 01.06.2026 & 30.05.2026 passed by the learned Additional Sessions Judge, Kherwara, District Udaipur, in Criminal Miscellaneous Case Nos. 188/2026, 184/2026 and 181/2026 respectively, whereby the bail applications filed by the accused-applicants under Section 483 of B.N.S.S. were rejected. The accused-applicants are behind the bars, pursuant to the F.I.R. No.85/2026 registered at Police Station Bavalwada, District Udaipur, for the offences punishable under Sections 109(1), 115(2), 126(2) & 189(2) of BNS, 2023.

2. Learned counsel for the applicants submit that the applicants have not even been named in the FIR and omnibus allegations have been leveled against 15 persons in the FIR. They further refer to the injuries inflicted upon the body of injured Balwant Singh and Ramsingh and assert that all the injuries have been found to be simple in nature. They further submit that except for recovery of a sword from applicant Sanjay Kumar, no recovery has been effected from any of the applicants. They further submit that though recovery of a sword has been made, however, the same has not been found to be bloodstained. They further submit that



similarly situated co-accused Lokesh Kumar Solviya has already been enlarged on bail by this Court vide order dated 10.06.2026 passed in S.B. Criminal Miscellaneous Bail Application No.7246/2026 (Lokesh Kumar Solviya vs. State of Rajasthan). They, therefore, implore this Court to allow the present bail applications.

3. Per contra, learned Public Prosecutor opposes the bail applications and submits that there is allegation of causing injuries by sharp edged weapon. Therefore, he submits that looking to the nature of offence, the applicants do not deserve to be enlarged on bail. However, he is not in a position to dispute the fact that similarly situated co-accused has already been enlarged on bail and the injuries found upon the body of the injured have been found to be simple in nature.

4. Heard learned counsel for the applicants as well as the learned Public Prosecutor and perused the material available on record.

5. Having considered the arguments advanced by learned counsel for the parties and having regard to the facts and circumstances of the case, more particularly the fact that similarly situated co-accused Lokesh Kumar Solviya has already been enlarged on bail by this Court, the applicants have not been named in the FIR and are not having any criminal antecedents, injuries have been found to be simple in nature, this Court *prima facie* finds it to be a fit case to enlarge the accused-applicants on bail.



6. Thus, without expressing any opinion on merits/demerits of the case, this Court is inclined to enlarge the accused-applicants on bail.

7. Consequently, all three bail applications under Section 483 B.N.S.S. are **allowed**. It is ordered that the accused-applicants; **(1) Sanjay Kumar Garasiya S/o Ramlal Garasiya, (2) Sumit S/o Chetan Bhagora, (3) Rohit Kumar Bhagora S/o Chetan Bhagora, (4) Mannalal Bhagora S/o Pintu Lal Bhagora, (5) Avinash Solviya S/o Babu Lal Solviya & (6) Ajay Garasia S/o Shri Rajendra Garasia** arrested in connection with F.I.R. No.85/2026 registered at Police Station Bavalwada, District Udaipur, shall be released on bail, if not wanted in any other case, provided each of them furnishes a personal bond of Rs.50,000/- and two sureties of Rs.25,000/- each, to the satisfaction of learned Trial Court, for their appearance before that Court on each & every date of hearing and whenever called upon to do so till completion of the trial.

8. It is further, made clear that findings recorded/observations made herein-above are for limited purposes of adjudication of bail applications and the same shall not prejudice the trial of the case in any manner.
