This application for bail under Section 483 of BNSS has been filed by the petitioner who has been arrested in connection with FIR No.239/2025 registered at Police Station Mukta Prasad Nagar, District Bikaner, for offences under Sections 306 & 331(4) of BNS.

Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned Public Prosecutor. Perused the material available on record.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the offences alleged to have been committed by the petitioner are triable by a Court of Magistrate. Furthermore, the co-accused, namely, Gourav Kumar, has already been enlarged on bail by a Co-ordinate Bench of this Court vide order dated 12.06.2026. Learned counsel submits that the petitioner is in judicial custody since 17.05.2026 and that the trial of the case will take a sufficiently long time; therefore, the benefit of bail may be granted to the accused-petitioner.

Per contra, learned Public Prosecutor has opposed the bail application.



This court has considered the arguments raised by the learned counsel for the parties. The offences pressed against petitioner are triable by a Court of Magistrate. The co-accused, namely, Gaurav Kumar, has already been enlarged on bail by a Co-ordinate Bench of this Court. The petitioner is in judicial custody since 17.05.2026, therefore, this Court is inclined to grant the benefit of bail to the accused-petitioner.

Hence, keeping in view of the fact that conclusion of the trial of the case is likely to take time and the prosecution has not shown any apprehension of the petitioner fleeing away from justice, in case he is enlarged on bail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, I deem it just and proper to grant bail to the petitioner under Section 483 of BNSS.

Consequently, the bail application under Section 483 of BNSS is allowed. It is ordered that the accused-petitioner **Avnish Kumar S/o Prem Chand** arrested in connection with FIR No.239/2025, shall be released on bail, if not wanted in any other case, provided he furnishes a personal bond of Rs.50,000/- and two sureties of Rs.25,000/- each, to the satisfaction of learned trial court, for his appearance before that court on each & every date of hearing and whenever called upon to do so till completion of the trial.
