This application for bail under Section 483 of BNSS has been filed by the petitioner who has been arrested in connection with FIR No.96/2026 registered at Police Station Kotwali, District Banswara for offences under Sections 318(4), 316(2), 340(2), 61(2) of BNS.

Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned Public Prosecutor. Perused the material available on record.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the offences alleged to have been committed by the petitioner are triable by court of Magistrate. It is further submitted that the allegation against the petitioner are that he sold a plot which was allegedly not in his name. However, the said plot is in the name of the

petitioner. Learned counsel contends that the said allegation is factually incorrect as it is further submitted that moreover, the cheque amounting to Rs. 4,80,500/- has already been dishonored and no payment has been received apart from the alleged amount of Rs.19,500/-. It is submitted that the investigation is complete against the petitioner and nothing has been recovered from him. Learned counsel submits that the petitioner is in judicial custody and the trial of the case will take sufficiently long time, therefore, the benefit of bail may be granted to the accused-petitioner.

Per contra, learned Public Prosecutor has opposed the bail application.

Having considered the rival submissions, facts and circumstances of the case, keeping in view of the fact that the offences are triable by the Court of Magistrate, conclusion of the trial of the case is likely to take time and the prosecution has not shown any apprehension of the petitioner fleeing away from justice, in case he is enlarged on bail; but, without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, I deem it just and proper to grant bail to the petitioner under Section 483 of BNSS.

Consequently, the bail application under Section 483 of BNSS is allowed. It is ordered that the accused-petitioner **Ali Husain Siyapurawala S/o Rajab Ali Siyapurwla**, arrested in connection with FIR No.96/2026 registered at Police Station Kotwali, District Banswara, shall be released on bail, if not wanted in any other case, provided he furnishes a personal bond of Rs.50,000/- and two sureties of Rs.25,000/- each, to the satisfaction of learned trial court, for his appearance before that



court on each & every date of hearing and whenever called upon to do so till completion of the trial.
