This application for bail under Section 483 BNSS (439 Cr.P.C.) has been filed by the petitioner who has been arrested in connection with F.I.R. No.44/2026 registered at Police Station Mawali, District Udaipur for offences under Sections 190, 191(2), 191(3), 333, 126(2), 74, 76, 140(3) and 110 of BNS, 2023.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner is a lady who has been falsely implicated in the present case and that the allegation against the petitioner is that she along with her husband and two-three other persons, entered the house of the complainant and inflicted injuries with an iron rod and a wooden stick. It is contended that the FIR only contains omnibus allegations and no specific injury has been attributed to the petitioner. It is further submitted that the petitioner is a lady

having a nine-month-old infant daughter and documents in support thereof have been placed on record. He further submitted that the petitioner is in judicial custody since 07.06.2026; no recovery has been effected from the petitioner and the trial of the case will take sufficiently long time, therefore, the benefit of bail may be granted to the accused-petitioner.

Per contra, learned Public Prosecutor has opposed the bail application.

Heard learned counsel for the parties perused the material available on record.

In the present case, omnibus allegations have been levelled against the accused in the FIR. No specific injury has been attributed to the petitioner. Furthermore, the investigation from the petitioner is completed and nothing has been recovered from the petitioner. Moreover, the petitioner is a lady having a nine month old infant daughter, who needs to be lookafter. In view of the facts and circumstances, petitioner is also entitled to be given the benefit of the first proviso to Section 480(1) of the BNSS.

Keeping in view of the fact that the petitioner is in custody since 07.06.2026 and conclusion of the trial of the case is likely to take time and the prosecution has not shown any apprehension of the petitioner fleeing away from justice, in case she is enlarged on bail; but, without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, I deem it just and proper to grant bail to the petitioner under Section 483 of BNSS.

Consequently, the bail application under Section 483 BNSS (439 Cr.P.C.) is allowed. It is ordered that the accused-petitioner

Leela Devi W/o Naresh Chandra arrested in connection with FIR No.44/2026 registered at Police Station Mawali, District Udaipur, shall be released on bail, if not wanted in any other case, provided she furnishes a personal bond of Rs.50,000/- and two sureties of Rs.25,000/- each, to the satisfaction of learned trial court, for her appearance before that court on each & every date of hearing and whenever called upon to do so till completion of the trial.
