This application for bail under Section 483 of BNSS has been filed by the petitioner who has been arrested in connection with F.I.R. No.417/2023 registered at Police Station Pindwara, District Sirohi, for offences under Sections 8/15, 25, 29 of the NDPS Act.

Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned Public Prosecutor. Perused the material available on record.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the contraband recovered in the present case is below commercial quantity and the same is stated to have been recovered from Rajendra and Kalu Ram. He further submits that the petitioner has been enroped on the basis of their statements and that the bail was rejected solely on the ground that he had been absconding however, he was present at his address and the allegations are false. He submits that the co-accused has already been enlarged on bail by the learned trial Court. Learned counsel submits that the petitioner is in judicial

custody and the trial of the case will take sufficiently long time; therefore, the benefit of bail may be granted to the accused-petitioner.

Per contra, learned Public Prosecutor has opposed the bail application.

This court has considered the argument raised by learned counsel for the petitioner. The contraband recovered from the petitioner is below commercial quantity and the same is set to be recovered from Rajendra and Kalu Ram. He has been enroped on the basis of statements of the co-accused. The co-accused Rajendra and Kalu Ram from whom the recovery was made have already been enlarged on bail by the learned trial Court. The petitioner is behind the bars since 01.06.2026.

Hence, keeping in view of the fact that conclusion of the trial of the case is likely to take time and the prosecution has not shown any apprehension of the petitioner fleeing away from justice, in case he is enlarged on bail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, I deem it just and proper to grant bail to the petitioner under Section 483 of BNSS.

Consequently, the bail application under Section 483 of BNSS is allowed. It is ordered that the accused-petitioner **Sanjay Kumar S/o Radheshyam Jaat**, arrested in connection with FIR No.417/2023 registered at Police Station Pindwara, District Sirohi, shall be released on bail, if not wanted in any other case, provided he furnishes a personal bond of Rs.1,00,000/- and two sureties of Rs.50,000/- each, to the satisfaction of learned trial court, for his



appearance before that court on each & every date of hearing and whenever called upon to do so till completion of the trial.
