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**HON'BLE MR. JUSTICE ASHOK KUMAR JAIN**  
**Order**

**23/07/2026**

1. The present bail application under Section 483 of BNSS is filed by the applicant-accused **Ranjeet S/o Shri Budhram Valmiki** seeking bail in respect of a criminal case registered as FIR No.167/2026 dated 21.04.2026 registered at P.S. Sadar Ganganagar, District - Ganganagar, for the offence under Sections 140(3), 307, 115(2), 3(5) of BNS.
2. Learned counsel for the applicant submits that the applicant has been falsely implicated in the matter and the investigation against him is complete and he is no more required in investigation. He further submits that there are no chance of fleeing of applicant accused from the jurisdiction of this Hon'ble Court. He also submits that the applicant undertakes not to repeat offence and cooperate with investigation/trial, which will take time.
3. Learned counsel for the applicant submits that on basis of a report lodged by complainant injured the matter is



investigated and present petitioner was arrested on 22.04.2026. He also submitted that after framing of charge the complainant injured has been examined as PW-1 and he has turned hostile and not supported the case of prosecution. He also submitted that one criminal case was registered against present petitioner wherein the petitioner has been acquitted.

4. Learned Public Prosecutor has vehemently opposed the bail application and submitted that the allegations are grave and serious in nature.
5. Heard learned counsel for the petitioner-accused and learned Public Prosecutor. Perused the material placed on record by both the parties.
6. On basis of a report dated 21.04.2026 about incident in the evening of 20.04.2026 FIR No.167/2026 was registered at Police Station Sadar, District Sriganganagar against unnamed persons. After investigation police has filed a charge-sheet against Manpreet Singh, Ranjeet Singh and Gurjant Singh @ Janti. The statement of injured has been examined as PW-1 and he has turned hostile and not supported the case of prosecution. The complainant has even denied from identification of petitioner. One criminal case registered against the petitioner has already been disposed.
7. Upon hearing the arguments and perusing the record, we have found that the applicant-accused is no more required in the investigation and he is in custody for quite some time. The further proceedings will take its own time, therefore,



looking to entirety of facts and circumstances of the case and without expressing any opinion on merits of the case, the Court deems it appropriate to grant bail to the applicant-accused.

8. Thus, the instant bail application filed on behalf of applicant-accused **Ranjeet S/o Shri Budhram Valmiki**, is hereby allowed and the applicant-accused is ordered to be released on bail upon furnishing a personal bond of ₹50,000/- with two sureties of like amount to the satisfaction of the Trial Court with the following conditions:-

- (i) The applicant-accused shall not tamper with evidence or influence the witness in any manner.
- (ii) The applicant-accused shall not indulge in any criminal activity and shall not repeat any criminal offence punishable under the Law.
- (iii) The applicant-accused shall attend the hearing of the Trial Court on the date fixed by the Trial court or as and when asked to appear before the Trial Court.
- (iv) In case of any violation of above conditions, the bail granted to the applicant-accused shall be liable to be canceled.

9. The Registry is directed to send a copy of this order to the Trial Court through E-mail.
