This application for bail under Section 483 BNSS (439 Cr.P.C.) has been filed by the petitioner who has been arrested in connection with F.I.R. No.53/2017 registered at Police Station Delwada, District Rajsamand for offences under Sections 19/54, 54-D of the Excise Act, 1950 and 471 of the IPC.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the principal co-accused, namely, Manoj Kumar @ Vinod, from whose possession the alleged contraband articles were recovered, as well as the owner of Truck have already been enlarged on bail by a co-ordinate Bench of this Court vide orders dated 28.06.2017 and 21.07.2017 respectively. It is further submitted that the petitioner has been falsely implicated in the present case and had no role whatsoever in the alleged incident. Learned counsel contends that the offence against the petitioner are triable by court of Magistrate

and that the trial of the case will take sufficiently long time, therefore, the benefit of bail may be granted to the accused-petitioner.

Per contra, learned Public Prosecutor has opposed the bail application.

Heard learned counsel for the parties and perused the material available on record.

This Court has considered the rival submissions and perused the material available on record, keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the case, particularly the fact that the offences are triable by Court of Magistrate, the investigation has been completed, no recovery is required to be made from the petitioners, continued incarceration of the petitioner is not warranted. The accused-petitioner is in judicial custody since 03.06.2026 and conclusion of the trial of the case is likely to take time. Further, the prosecution has not shown any apprehension of the petitioner absconding or tampering with the evidence if released on bail. Therefore, without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this Court deems it just and proper to grant bail to the petitioner under Section 483 of BNSS.

Consequently, the bail application under Section 483 BNSS (439 Cr.P.C.) is allowed. It is ordered that the accused-petitioner **Ranveer @ Rajveer @ Rajesh S/o Chandra Singh** arrested in connection with FIR No.53/2017 registered at Police Station Delwada, Rajsamand, shall be released on bail, if not wanted in any other case, provided he furnishes a personal bond of Rs.50,000/- and two sureties of Rs.25,000/- each, to the

satisfaction of learned trial court, for his appearance before that court on each & every date of hearing and whenever called upon to do so till completion of the trial.
