This application for bail under Section 483 of BNSS has been filed by the petitioners who have been arrested in connection with FIR No.189/2024 registered at Police Station Kotwali Sirohi, District Sirohi, for offences under Sections 420, 406 and 120-B of the IPC.

Heard learned counsel for the petitioners and learned Public Prosecutor. Perused the material available on record.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that the offences alleged against the petitioners are triable by a Magistrate. He further submits that the FIR pertains to the year 2024 and that the petitioners have been arrested only now with a mala fide intention. It is contended that the petitioners have already cleared the account, and the investigating agency has not arrested the main accused.

Learned counsel further submits that the petitioners have been in judicial custody since 22.05.2026 and the investigation qua them stands completed. It is also submitted that the trial is likely to take a considerable amount of time to conclude. Therefore, it is prayed that the benefit of regular bail be granted to the accused-petitioners.

Per contra, learned Public Prosecutor has opposed the bail application.

This Court has considered the arguments raised by the learned counsel for the petitioners. The FIR is pertain to the gold loan which was avail by the petitioners. The certificate given by the valuer was not correct in several accounts. However, subsequently all the amounts have been deposited; the FIR was registered in the year 2024 and investigation in the matter is still going on.

Keeping in view of the fact that conclusion of the investigation/trial of the case is likely to take time and the prosecution has not shown any apprehension of the petitioner

fleeing away from justice, in case he is enlarged on bail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, I deem it just and proper to grant bail to the petitioners under Section 483 of BNSS.

Consequently, the bail application under Section 483 of BNSS is allowed. It is ordered that the accused-petitioners **Sheikh Amber S/o Gulam, Somnath S/o Anchita and Noor Mohammad S/o Zeharli** arrested in connection with FIR No.189/2024 registered at Police Station Kotwali Sirohi, District Sirohi, shall be released on bail, if not wanted in any other case, provided they furnish a personal bond of Rs.50,000/- and two sureties of Rs.25,000/- each, to the satisfaction of learned trial court, for their appearance before that court on each & every date of hearing and whenever called upon to do so till completion of the trial.
