1. The present bail application under Section 483 of BNSS is filed by the applicant-accused **Mohammed Saleem S/o Lal Khan** seeking bail in respect of a criminal case registered as FIR No.187/2026 dated 07.05.2026 registered at P.S. Sardarshahar, District - Churu, for the offence under Sections 318(4), 338, 336(3), 340(2) and 61(2)(a) of BNS, 2023.
2. Learned counsel for the applicant submits that the applicant has been falsely implicated in the matter and the investigation against him is complete and he is no more required in investigation. He further submits that there are no chance of fleeing of applicant accused from the

jurisdiction of this Hon'ble Court. The applicant does not have any criminal antecedents. He also submits that the applicant undertakes not to repeat offence and cooperate with investigation/trial, which will take time.

3. Learned counsel for the applicant-accused submits that, for alleged document of 26.04.2018, an FIR was registered on 07.05.2026. He also submitted that the land in question is in possession of accused for last sixty years and the complainant was never having possession at the time of the registration of FIR. He also referred order dated 24.06.2026 in S.B. Criminal Misc. Petition No.4315/2026 passed by the Co-ordinate Bench of this Court and submitted that during interim prosecution granted by this Court, the applicant-accused was arrested by Police. He also submitted that the accused-applicant is in custody since his arrest and the offences are triable by Magistrate First Class.
4. Learned Public Prosecutor and learned counsel for the complainant have vehemently opposed the bail application and submitted that the allegations are grave and serious in nature. Learned counsel for the complainant has submitted that there are three criminal cases were registered against the accused-applicant and he is the main accused, against whom there is charge of preparing forged documents.
5. Heard learned counsel for the parties and learned Public Prosecutor. Perused the material placed on record by both the parties.
6. On basis of complaint lodged by complainant Smt. Sampat Bothara about preparation of forged power of attorney and

other documents in FIR No.187/2026 dated 07.05.2026 was registered as Police Station Sardarshahar, District Churu. During investigation, present accused-applicant was arrested and he is in judicial custody.

7. Present accused-applicant and three other persons Lal Khan, Intajar Khan and Salim have filed S.B. Criminal Misc. Petition No.4315/2026 wherein an interim order is passed by Vacation Judge on 24.06.2026. Three more criminal cases were registered against the accused-applicant and one of them registered as FIR No.68/2025 at Police Station Sardarshahar, District Churu, is still under investigation.
8. The material on record clearly indicate that complainant, who is 67 years old female, who is owner of the land in question, has alleged that a forged power of attorney was prepared on 26.04.2018, on her behalf and on said day the complainant was out of India. The police investigation suggests that on basis of this power of attorney the land has been transferred by the present accused-applicant to his father Lal Khan on 29.10.2025 and Lal Khan has received KCC loan from the bank. The material clearly indicate that it is a case of systematic fraud played by the present accused-applicant and other persons, therefore, the act of the accused-applicant is of a grievous in nature.
9. The facts and the material indicate that the alleged offence are of serious nature and role attributed to applicant is prima facie sufficient to consider complicity of applicant in the crime. Therefore, at this juncture, considering the evidence

collected so far, this is not a fit case to enlarge the applicant accused on bail.

10. Considering the gravity of allegations and overall facts and circumstances of the case, it is appropriate to dismiss the bail application of the applicant accused at this stage.
11. Accordingly, the application for bail filed under Section 483 of BNSS preferred by **Mohammed Saleem S/o Lal Khan** is hereby dismissed.
