1. Heard learned counsel for the parties.
2. The present habeas corpus petition has been filed by the brother of the corpus Mst. 'A' alleging therein that she is in illegal detention of the respondent No.4.
3. In pursuance of the directions issued by this Court, the corpus Mst. 'A' has been produced before us.

4. We have conferred with the corpus Mst. 'A'. The corpus Mst. 'A' has stated before us that she is 42 years of age, has educational qualification uptill secondary and understands her well-being quite well. She has further stated that she is not having a cordial relationship with her husband and had gone with the respondent No.4 of her own free will without any pressure from any side. She has further stated that she is not in illegal detention of any person including the respondent No.4. She has expressed her desire to go and live with the present petitioner, who is her brother.

5. Having considered the statement made by the corpus Mst. 'A' before us, we are convinced that the corpus Mst. 'A' is not in illegal detention of any person including the respondent No.4. Since the corpus Mst. 'A' is a major literate lady understanding her well-being, therefore, she is free to live at a place and with a person of her choice.

6. In view of the discussion made above, the present habeas corpus petition is disposed of with a direction to the Investigating Agency to provide adequate security to the corpus Mst. 'A' till she reaches her place of residence.
