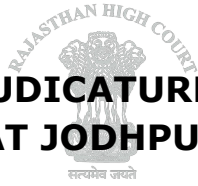

HON'BLE MR. JUSTICE MUKESH RAJPUROHIT

Order

07/08/2026

1. At the outset, learned counsel for the parties jointly submit that in an identical controversy, Coordinate Bench of this Court vide order dated 19.06.2026 passed in **SBCWP No.13019/2026 : Vikash Joshi & Ors. v. State of Rajasthan & Ors.**, disposed of the writ petition. The aforesaid order is reproduced hereunder:

- “1. Heard learned counsel for the petitioners.
2. The present writ petition has been filed with the following prayers:-

“It is, therefore, most humbly and respectfully prayed that the Writ Petition may kindly be allowed and by issuing an appropriate writ, order or direction:-

i. The impugned action/conduct on the part of Respondent College in replacing and disengaging the petitioners, be declared illegal and accordingly the communication letter dated 03.06.2026 (Annexure-4) to the extent of the petitioners, be also declared illegal and be quashed and set aside.

ii. The respondent college may further kindly be directed to continue the petitioners on the post of Nurse Grade-II with all consequential benefits and

respondent college and the respondent outsourcing agencies may further kindly be restrained from engaging anyone else on the post of Nurse Grade-II, which are being manned by the petitioners on contractual basis.

iii. Or, in view of the communication dated 15.06.2026 (Annexure-06), whereby, it is apparent that several posts of Nursing Officer are lying vacant and vacancies are available, the respondents be directed to consider continuation of the petitioners against such available vacancies and thereafter not to replace them by another set of contractual employees till regularly selected candidates under the provisions of The Rajasthan Medical & Health Subordinate Service Rules, 1965 are made available.

iv. Any other appropriate relief which this Hon'ble High Court deems just and proper in the facts and circumstances of the case may kindly be passed in favor of the petitioners."

3. Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that the petitioners were appointed on the contract basis for a period till 31.03.2027 or till regularly selected employees under Rajasthan Contractual Hiring to Civil Post Rules, 2022 are available with the respondent-Department, whichever is earlier. Learned counsel submits that the regularly selected employees are available with the respondent-Department, thus, the services of the petitioners have been dispensed with vide order dated 03.06.2026.

4. Learned counsel further submits that after the regularly selected persons having joined in the respondent- Department, still there are number of vacancies available with the respondent-Department for the post of Nursing Officer. He, therefore, prays that the respondents may be directed that in case, there are vacancies available in the Department and they are in need of services of the petitioners, the petitioners' services can be adjusted in the nearby areas.

5. Considering the limited prayer of the petitioners, the writ petition is disposed of with a direction to the respondent No.4 & respondent No.5 to ascertain the number of vacancies available with them in their jurisdiction and if they desire to take the services of the petitioners on the post available, the petitioners may be adjusted or accommodated to serve on those posts till the regularly selected candidates are available with the respondent-Department.

6. It is made clear that if any of the petitioners are not discharging their duties satisfactorily, the respondents will be free to discharge them from the employment.

7. Stay petition as well as other pending applications, if any, shall also stand disposed of."

2. In view of the above, the present writ petition is also disposed of with a direction to the petitioners to submit a representation before respondent Nos.6 and 9 within a period of two weeks, along with a copy of the order rendered in *Vikash Joshi (supra)*.

Upon receipt of such representation, respondent Nos. 6 and 9 shall consider and decide the same in the light of the order passed in *Vikash Joshi (supra)*.

3. It is further directed that respondent Nos. 6 and 9 shall ascertain the number of vacancies available within their jurisdiction and, if they desire to engage the services of the petitioners against the available contractual posts, the petitioners may be adjusted or accommodated on such posts till regularly selected candidates become available with the respondent-Department.

4. It is made clear that if the petitioners are not discharging their duties satisfactorily, the respondents will be free to discharge them from the employment.

5. Stay application as well as other pending applications, if any, shall also stand disposed of.
