1. These applications for bail have been filed by the petitioners under Section 483 of BNSS (old Section 439 of Cr.P.C.). The requisite details of the matter are tabulated herein below:

2. Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that the petitioners have been falsely implicated in the case and false allegations have been levelled against them. Co-accused Vishal has been enlarged on bail vide order dated 18.06.2026 by a Co-ordinate Bench of this Court while considering S.B. Criminal Misc. Bail Application No.7645/2026. He further submits that the roles assigned to the present petitioners are in no manner distinguishable viz-a-viz role assigned to co-accused Vishal, who has already been enlarged on bail. The petitioners do not have any criminal antecedents and are in judicial custody since 31.05.2026 and the trial will take sufficiently long time, therefore, they deserve to be enlarged on bail.

3. Learned Public Prosecutor vehemently opposes this bail application, however, he is not in a position to refute the fact that the roles assigned to the present petitioners are in no manner distinguishable viz-a-viz role assigned to co-accused Vishal.

4. Heard learned counsel for the petitioners and learned Public Prosecutor and perused the material available on record.

5. Having considered the rival submissions, facts and circumstances of this case and after perusing the challan so also considering the fact that the petitioners do not have any criminal antecedents and the roles assigned to them are in no manner

distinguishable viz-a-viz the role assigned to co-accused Vishal, who has already been enlarged on bail, in the considered opinion of this Court, no fruitful purpose would be served by keeping the petitioners behind the bars for an indefinite period as the trial will take sufficiently long time. Thus, without expressing any opinion on merits/demerits of the case, this Court is of the opinion that the bail applications filed by the petitioners deserve to be accepted.

6. Accordingly, the bail applications filed under Section 483 of BNSS are allowed. It is ordered that petitioners- **Raju @ Rajesh S/o Manish** and **Deepak Kumar @ Vipul S/o Ramesh** shall be released on bail in connection with the aforesaid FIR; provided they execute personal bond in the sum of Rs.50,000/- each with two sound and solvent sureties of Rs.25,000/- each to the satisfaction of learned trial Court for their appearance before that court on each and every date of hearing and whenever called upon to do so till the completion of the trial.

7. It is however, made clear that findings recorded/observations made above are for limited purposes of adjudication of bail applications. The trial court shall not get prejudiced by the same.
