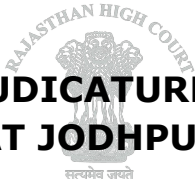

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**HON'BLE DR. JUSTICE NUPUR BHATI**

**Order**

**07/08/2026**

1. The present writ petition has been filed by the petitioner under Article 226 and 227 of the Constitution of India seeking following relief:

“It is therefore most respectfully prayed that this writ petition may kindly be allowed and the respondent authority may be directed to pass order in pursuant to, the notice dated 18.06.2026 (Annexure-2.) after giving proper opportunity of hearing to the petitioner.

It is further prayed that during pendency of the present petition if any order in pursuant to the notice dated 18.06.2026 is passed than same may kindly ordered to be quashed and set aside in toto.

It is further prayed that respondent authority may be directed to proceed as per the law applicable”

2. Counsel representing the parties, at the outset, jointly submit that the issue involved in the writ petition is squarely covered by the judgment dated 13.07.2026 passed by the Coordinate Bench of this Court at Jodhpur in **SBCWP No.13243/2026 : Peer Mohammad Shah Jilani Dargah Samiti v. State of Rajasthan & Ors.** (along with other connected bunch of petitions); whereby, the Coordinate Bench of this Court has dismissed the writ petitions.

3. Thus, in view of the submissions made by counsel representing the parties, the instant writ petition stands dismissed in the same terms as in the case of *Peer Mohammad Shah Jilani Dargah Samiti (supra)*.

4. Stay application as well as all other pending applications, if any, also stand dismissed.
