By way of filing the present criminal writ petition, the
petitioner has prayed for the following reliefs:-

"It is, therefore, respectfully prayed that this Criminal Writ Petition may kindly be allowed and the respondents may kindly be directed to provide police protection to petitioner and to ensure the safety of the petitioner, in the interest of justice from the private non-petitioners and other anti-social elements.

Any other relief which is considered just and proper may be granted in favor of the petitioner."

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner apprehends a threat to his life and liberty at the hands of the private respondents, as they are aggrieved by his having been declared the successor to late Shri Mahant Dutt Narayan Giriji Maharaj. According to learned counsel, the petitioner was declared the successor to the monastery by late Shri Mahant Dutt Narayan Giriji Maharaj in the presence of the villagers and after due performance of the requisite religious ceremonies. Learned counsel further submitted that the petitioner has approached the police authorities on several occasions seeking adequate protection and security, but no effective action has been taken.

3. Taking into consideration the overall facts and circumstances of the case, this Court deems it just and proper to dispose of the present criminal writ petition with a direction to the petitioner to submit a detailed representation ventilating his grievances before the Superintendent of Police, Balotra, and the concerned SHO within a period of seven days from today, along with a certified copy of this order.

4. In the event the petitioner submits such representation before the Superintendent of Police, Balotra, and the concerned SHO within the stipulated period, they shall cause an appropriate inquiry to be conducted into the matter and, if so warranted, shall provide adequate

and effective protection to the life and liberty of the petitioner, strictly in accordance with law.

5. All pending applications, if any, shall also stand disposed of.
