1. The present bail application under Section 483 of BNSS is filed by the applicant-accused **Saroop Singh S/o Avatar Singh Raisikh** seeking bail in respect of a criminal case registered as FIR No.171/2026 dated 23.03.2026 registered at P.S. Pilibanga, District - Hanumangarh, for the offence under Sections 316(2), 61(2)(a) of BNS.
2. Learned counsel for the applicant submits that the applicant has been falsely implicated in the matter and the investigation against him is complete and he is no more required in investigation. He further submits that there are no chance of fleeing of applicant accused from the jurisdiction of this Hon'ble Court. He also submits that the

applicant undertakes not to repeat offence and cooperate with investigation/trial, which will take time.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the offence pertains to Sections 316(2), 61(2)(a) of BNS, the same is triable by Magistrate First Class. He also submits that accused Sonu Singh was granted anticipatory bail by this Hon'ble Court on 13.05.2026. He also submitted that petitioner accused is in custody since 10.06.2026 and there is no criminal antecedent against him.
4. Learned Public Prosecutor has vehemently opposed the bail application and submitted that the allegations are grave and serious in nature.
5. Heard learned counsel for the petitioner-accused and learned Public Prosecutor. Perused the material placed on record by both the parties.
6. We have considered the anticipatory bail application of Sonu Singh under Section 482 of BNSS on 13.05.2026, wherein para No.6 it has been observed in as under :

"6. On 23.03.2026, Suman Kumari, Branch Manager of Poonawala Fincorp Limited Gold Loan, (NBFC) has lodged an FIR No. 171/2026 with the allegation that on 13.03.2026, Sarup Singh and the present petitioner have visited their Company and Sonu Singh was sanctioned a loan of ₹2,05,000/- but thereafter Sarup Singh has visited with documents on 16.03.2026. The total ₹10,23,500/- were transferred to Sarup Singh on the ground that he will close the loan account from other Company and will place the gold with complainant Company, but he has not submitted anything till 17.03.2026. After registration of FIR under Section 316(2) and 61(2)(a) of BNS, the matter is investigated. There is one more case under the NDPS Act against the petitioner. The material indicate that alleged

transaction was between Sarup Singh and the NBFC regarding loan amount of ₹10,23,500/-. There is no material to show any conspiracy between petitioner and Sarup Singh."

7. Upon hearing the arguments and perusing the record, we have found that the applicant-accused is no more required in the investigation and he is in custody since 10.06.2026 and the offence is triable by Magistrate, though the main allegation is upon the present petitioner, but there is no criminal antecedents against him. The further proceedings will take its own time, therefore, looking to entirety of facts and circumstances of the case and without expressing any opinion on merits of the case, the Court deems it appropriate to grant bail to the applicant-accused.
8. Thus, the instant bail application filed on behalf of applicant-accused **Saroop Singh S/o Avatar Singh Raisikh**, is hereby allowed and the applicant-accused is ordered to be released on bail upon furnishing a personal bond of ₹50,000/- with two sureties of like amount to the satisfaction of the Trial Court with the following conditions:-
 - (i) The applicant-accused shall not tamper with evidence or influence the witness in any manner.
 - (ii) The applicant-accused shall not indulge in any criminal activity and shall not repeat any criminal offence punishable under the Law.
 - (iii) The applicant-accused shall attend the hearing of the Trial Court on the date fixed by the Trial court or as and when asked to appear before the Trial Court.

(iv) In case of any violation of above conditions, the bail granted to the applicant-accused shall be liable to be canceled.

9. The Registry is directed to send a copy of this order to the Trial Court through E-mail.
