1. After arguing for some time, learned counsel for the petitioners seeks permission to withdraw the writ petition with a liberty to file a representation before the competent authority to consider petitioners' candidatures also in light of judgment dated 08.01.2020, passed by Jaipur Bench in D.B. SAW No.908/2017, Namonarayan Sharma Vs. State & Ors.

2. The present writ petition is, therefore, dismissed as withdrawn with a direction to the petitioner to file a representation before the competent authority, seeking consideration of petitioners' case also in light of the Division Bench judgment rendered in the case of Namonarayan (supra). The stay application also stands dismissed.

3. In case the respondents do not consider petitioners' case in light of judgment dated 08.01.2020, petitioners will be free to take appropriate remedies including filing of fresh writ petition.

4. This order has been passed based on the submissions made in the petition, the respondents would be free to examine the veracity of the submissions made in the petition and only in case, the averments made therein are found to be correct, the petitioners would be entitled to the relief.
