1. The present bail application under Section 483 of BNSS is filed by the applicant-accused **Harish Kumar S/o Shri Briz Lal** seeking bail in respect of a criminal case registered as FIR No.158/2026 dated 11.05.2026 registered at P.S. Hanumangarh Sadar, District - Hanumangarh, for the offence under Sections 19/54, 54(A) of Rajasthan Excise Act.
2. Learned counsel for the applicant submits that the applicant has been falsely implicated in the matter and the investigation against him is complete and he is no more required in investigation. He further submits that there are no chance of fleeing of applicant accused from the jurisdiction of this Hon'ble Court. He also submits that the



applicant undertakes not to repeat offence and cooperate with investigation/trial, which will take time.

3. Learned counsel for the applicant submits that FIR is registered against unknown persons and recovery has been effected from an abandoned car. He also submitted that there is no criminal antecedent against the petitioner and the recovered quantity at the most is 86 bulk litre and offence is triable by Magistrate first class.
4. Learned Public Prosecutor has vehemently opposed the bail application and submitted that the allegations are grave and serious in nature.
5. Heard learned counsel for the petitioner-accused and learned Public Prosecutor. Perused the material placed on record by both the parties.
6. On basis of a search and seizure by Rajendra Kumar, Police Station Hanumangarh Sadar on 11.05.2026, 10 cartons of country made liquor was recovered from a car No. RJ-10-CA-5659. Each of the carton contain 48 quarter of liquor. The total recovery is of 86 litres and FIR No.158/2026 was registered at Police Station Hanumangarh Sadar. The offence is triable by Magistrate and there is no criminal antecedent against the petitioner.
7. Upon hearing the arguments and perusing the record, we have found that the applicant-accused is no more required in the investigation and he is in custody for quite some time. The further proceedings will take its own time, therefore, looking to entirety of facts and circumstances of the case and without expressing any opinion on merits of the case,



the Court deems it appropriate to grant bail to the applicant-accused.

8. Thus, the instant bail application filed on behalf of applicant-accused **Harish Kumar S/o Shri Briz Lal**, is hereby allowed and the applicant-accused is ordered to be released on bail upon furnishing a personal bond of ₹50,000/- with two sureties of like amount to the satisfaction of the Trial Court with the following conditions:-

- (i) The applicant-accused shall not tamper with evidence or influence the witness in any manner.
- (ii) The applicant-accused shall not indulge in any criminal activity and shall not repeat any criminal offence punishable under the Law.
- (iii) The applicant-accused shall attend the hearing of the Trial Court on the date fixed by the Trial court or as and when asked to appear before the Trial Court.
- (iv) In case of any violation of above conditions, the bail granted to the applicant-accused shall be liable to be canceled.
