Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that, in the present case, the main notice issued to Naresh Infra Project Private Limited and its directors has been stayed by this Court in *D.B. Civil Writ Petition No. 10460/2025* vide order dated 23.05.2025. It is further submitted that the proceedings pursuant to the summons issued were also stayed in *S.B. Criminal Misc. Petition No. 3102/2025*, filed by Naresh Kumar Agarwal. It is contended that, despite the aforesaid interim orders, the respondents have now issued similar notices to other persons on the ground that they are connected with the business. It is submitted that once the main proceedings have been stayed, the

proceedings against other employees cannot be permitted to continue.

Issue notice.

Mr. Kuldeep Vaishnav, learned counsel, accepts notice on behalf of the respondents.

List the matter after six weeks along with S.B. Criminal Misc. Petition Nos. 7680/2025 and 3102/2025.

Learned counsel appearing for the department opposes the prayer made by the petitioner.

This Court has gone through the orders placed on record and finds that interim orders are operating, having been passed by the Division Bench as well as by the Coordinate Bench of this Court in the criminal miscellaneous petition. The case of the present petitioner does not appear to be distinguishable. In view of the same, it is directed that the petitioner shall not be arrested in connection with the summons dated 30.06.2026, placed on record as Annexure-1.

However, the petitioner shall appear before the concerned authority on 27.07.2026 and thereafter as and when called upon, and shall submit the requisite documents and explanation.
