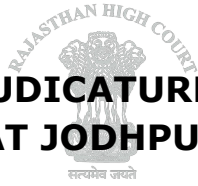

HON'BLE MR. JUSTICE SANDEEP SHAH**Order****24/07/2026**

1. The applicants have filed the present bail applications under Section 483 of BNSS being aggrieved against the orders dated 06.07.2026 & 02.07.2026 passed by the learned Additional Session Judge, Sadul Shahr, Sriganganagar, in Criminal Miscellaneous Case Nos. 159/2026 (Ravi vs. State of Rajasthan), 158/2026 (Ajay vs. State of Rajasthan), 154/2026 (Praveen vs. State of Rajasthan) and 153/2026 (Sonu vs. State of Rajasthan), whereby the bail applications filed by the accused-applicants under Section 483 of B.N.S.S. were rejected. The accused-applicants are behind the bars, pursuant to the F.I.R. No.274/2026 registered at Police Station Sadul Shahr, District Sriganganagar, for the offences punishable under Sections 8, 21 & 29 of the NDPS Act, 1985.

2. Learned counsel for the applicants submit that the recovered contraband is below the threshold limit of commercial quantity, inasmuch as, 11.64 grams of heroin has been recovered from the conscious possession of applicant Ravi, and applicant Praveen was a co-occupant of the motorcycle, while the remaining two applicants, i.e. Sonu and Ajay, have been implicated with the aid

of Section 29 of the NDPS Act, 1985. They further submit that except for applicant Ajay, none of the applicants have any criminal antecedent of an identical nature. They further submit that as far as applicant Ajay is concerned, he has one criminal antecedent of an identical nature, which has been pending since the year 2022. They further submit that the trial is likely to take a sufficiently long time to conclude. They, therefore, implore this Court to allow the present bail applications.

3. Per contra, learned Public Prosecutor opposes the bail applications. However, he is not in a position to dispute the fact that the recovered contraband is below the threshold limit of commercial quantity.

4. Heard learned counsel for the applicant as well as the learned Public Prosecutor and perused the material available on record.

5. Having considered the arguments advanced by learned counsel for the parties and having regard to the facts and circumstances of the case, more particularly the facts that the recovered contraband is below the threshold limit of commercial quantity, the embargo under Section 37 of the NDPS Act, 1985, would not apply to the case in hand, further, except for applicant – Ajay (who has an old case pending of the year 2022), none of the applicants have any criminal antecedents of identical nature, and the trial is likely to take a sufficiently long time to conclude, this Court *prima facie* finds it to be a fit case to enlarge the accused-applicants on bail.

6. Thus, without expressing any opinion on merits/demerits of the case, this Court is inclined to enlarge the accused-applicants on bail.

7. Consequently, the bail applications under Section 483 B.N.S.S. are **allowed**. It is ordered that the accused-applicants; **(1) Praveen S/o Shri Ram Sawroop, (2) Sonu S/o Shri Mana Singh, (3) Ravi S/o Mahender & (4) Ajay S/o Shri Bhoop Ram** arrested in connection with F.I.R. No.274/2026 registered at Police Station Sadul Shahar, District Sriganganagar, shall be released on bail, if not wanted in any other case, provided each of them furnishes a personal bond of Rs.50,000/- and two sureties of Rs.25,000/- each, to the satisfaction of learned Trial Court, for their appearance before that Court on each & every date of hearing and whenever called upon to do so till completion of the trial.

8. It is further, made clear that findings recorded/observations made herein-above are for limited purposes of adjudication of bail applications and the same shall not prejudice the trial of the case in any manner.
