1. The applicant has filed the present bail application under Section 483 of BNSS being aggrieved against the order dated 06.07.2026 passed by the learned Additional Sessions Judge, Sangariya, District Hanumangarh in Criminal Misc. Bail Case No.138/2026, whereby the bail application filed by the accused-applicant under Section 483 of B.N.S.S. was rejected. The accused-applicant is behind the bars, pursuant to the F.I.R. No.631/2024 registered at Police Station Sangariya, District Hanumangarh for the offence punishable under Sections 8 & 21 of NDPS Act.
2. Learned counsel for the applicant submits that the narcotic contraband, i.e., heroin weighing 13.16 grams, has been recovered from the co-accused Manpreet Singh @ Judge, which is below the threshold limit of commercial quantity. Learned counsel

further submits that the applicant has no previous criminal antecedents of an identical nature. Learned counsel further submits that the applicant has been in judicial custody and that the trial is likely to take a considerable amount of time to conclude. Learned counsel, therefore, prays that the benefit of bail be granted to the accused-applicant.

3. *Per contra*, learned Public Prosecutor opposes the bail application. However, he is not in a position to dispute the fact that the recovered contraband is below the commercial quantity.

4. Heard learned counsel for the applicant as well as learned Public Prosecutor and perused the material available on record.

5. Having considered the arguments advanced by both sides and having regard to the facts and circumstances of the case, including the facts that the narcotic contraband recovered in the present case is below the threshold limit of commercial quantity, the applicant has no criminal antecedents of an identical nature and the applicant has been behind bars and that the trial is likely to take a considerable amount of time to conclude, this Court, without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, is inclined to enlarge the applicant on bail.

6. Consequently, the bail application under Section 483 B.N.S.S. is **allowed**. It is ordered that the accused-applicant **Ajmer Singh @ Juber S/o Basan Singh**, arrested in connection with F.I.R. No.631/2024 registered at Police Station Sangariya, District Hanumangarh shall be released on bail, if not wanted in any other case, provided he furnishes a personal bond of Rs.1,00,000/- and two sureties of Rs.50,000/- each, to the satisfaction of learned trial court, for his appearance before that

court on each & every date of hearing and whenever called upon to do so till completion of the trial.

7. It is further, made clear that the findings recorded/observations made herein above are for limited purposes of adjudication of bail application and the same shall not prejudice the trial of the case in any manner.
