1. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the controversy involved in the present writ petition is squarely covered by the judgment dated 20.01.2020 passed by the Coordinate Bench of this Court in **S.B. Civil Writ Petition No. 14638/2019, Chandra Kanta v. State of Rajasthan & Anr.** and the batch of connected writ petitions. He submits that the Coordinate Bench, while allowing the said writ petitions, held that

transfer orders whereby the petitioners were transferred from their respective Panchayat Samitis without specifying the place of their posting/joining could not be sustained.

2. Upon directions of this Court, Mr. I.R. Choudhary, learned AAG puts in appearance on behalf of respondents and prays for and is granted time to complete his instructions.

3. Office is directed to reflect the name of Mr. I.R. Choudhary, AAG, as counsel appearing for the respondents in the cause list.

4. In the meanwhile, the effect and operation of the impugned order dated 10.07.2026 (Annex.P/2 & P/3) shall remain stayed qua the petitioner, in case, he has not joined at the new place of posting.

5. Mr. I.R. Choudhary, learned AAG, appearing on behalf of the respondents, would be at liberty to file application under Article 226(3) of the Constitution of India for vacation of interim order.
