1. Mr. S.K. Dadhich, learned counsel for the complainant, submits that, strangely, the petitioner has not impleaded the complainant as a party respondent.
2. Learned counsel for the petitioner is directed to file an application for impleading the complainant as a party respondent.
3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that, in the first medical report, all the injuries were found to be simple in nature. Subsequently, on the request made by the complainant, a second medical board was constituted, which gave its report in May 2012 and found one injury to be grievous in nature. He asserts that the incident occurred on 04.09.2011, and the medical board, without assigning any reason, after a period of six months, declared one of the injuries as grievous in nature, thereby attracting Section 326 of IPC. He further asserts that a cross-case was lodged, and the

present FIR in question was filed only after the petitioner had lodged his FIR.

4. On the other hand, learned counsel for the respondent submits that the initial medical report was prepared on the 05.09.2011 itself, which is evident from the injury report at page 40. He further submits that the FIR filed by the complainant was not initially registered by the police officials and was lodged at a later stage pursuant to the directions of the Court. He also submits that the documents placed on record by the petitioner are not part of the case diary, and the constitution of the medical board has no bearing on the injury sustained by the complainant.

5. Considering the submissions made, call for the record from the trial Court of Session Case No.53/2020 (State of Rajasthan v. Nand Kishore & Anr.) along with record of Session Case No. 52/2020 (State of Rajasthan v. Bankarlal).

6. List the matter after four weeks.
