1. The petitioner has filed this bail application under Section 483 of BNSS in FIR No.143/2023 registered at Police Station Sanchore, District Jalore for offence under Sections 8/18, 29 of NDPS Act.
2. Heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned Public Prosecutor and perused the material available on record.
3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has falsely been implicated in this case. He further submits that nothing has been recovered from the conscious possession of the present petitioner. The contraband 5.74 KG. Opium has been recovered from Mawa Ram. He again submits that on the basis of disclosure statement of Mawa Ram, petitioner has been implicated in this case. Except that there is no other connecting evidence established in the investigation. Therefore, conditions of Section 37 of NDPS Act are duly satisfied in this case. He again submits

that the petitioner is behind the bars since 01.06.2025 with criminal past of four cases in which three cases are of different nature. He also submits that charge-sheet has been filed and the trial of the case may take considerable time and no further custodial interrogation is required, hence the bail application of the petitioner may be allowed.

4. Learned Public Prosecutor has vehemently opposed the bail application.

5. On consideration of the rival submissions and material available on record and in the light of submission made by learned counsel for the petitioner but without expressing any opinion on merits/demerits of the case, I am inclined to grant benefit of bail to the petitioner.

6. Consequently, the bail application under Section 483 B.N.S.S. is allowed and it is directed that the petitioner **Gopal Anjana S/o Shankar Lal**, be released on bail provided he furnishes a personal bond in the sum of Rs.50,000/- with two sureties in the sum of Rs.25,000/- each to the satisfaction of the learned trial court with the stipulation that he shall appear before that Court on all subsequent dates of hearing till conclusion of the trial.
