The instant writ petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India has been filed by the petitioners seeking the following reliefs:-

"It is therefore, most respectfully prayed that this Hon'ble court may very graciously be pleased to accept and allow this writ petition and further be pleased to issue an appropriate writ order or direction in the nature thereof thereby:

i) the action of the respondents impugned order dated 08.06.2023 (Annexure-6) may kindly be quashed and set aside and may kindly declared per se bad in the eye of law, unjust, arbitrary, discriminatory and violative to the Articles 14, 16, 21 and 311 of the Constitution of India; and/or

ii) the and the respondent No. 3 may kindly be directed to decided the representation dated 26.05.2025 (Annex-7) and 16.07.2025 (Annex-8) filed by the petitioner.
iii) Pass any other appropriate order which this Hon'ble Court may deem fit, just and proper in the facts and circumstances of the case in favour of the petitioner.
vi) Cost of the writ petition be also awarded in favour of the petitioner."

2. After arguing the matter at some length, learned counsel for the petitioners submitted that the petitioners would be satisfied if the competent authority of the respondent department is directed to consider and decide the representation dated 16.07.2025 submitted by him, seeking withdrawal of the restrictions imposed upon their plots vide order dated 08.06.2023 with regard to sale, transfer, issuance of patta, etc., as the investigation in relation to FIR No. 115/2023 has already been completed by the investigating agency.

3. This Court, after hearing learned counsel for the petitioners, finds the limited prayer made on behalf of the petitioners to be reasonable. Accordingly, the present writ petition is disposed of with liberty to the petitioners to file a detailed representation along with a certified copy of this order within a period of two weeks from today before the office of the District Collector, Bhilwara.

4. In the event such representation is filed, the District Collector, Bhilwara shall consider and decide the same in accordance with law as expeditiously as possible, preferably within a period of eight weeks thereafter.

5. It is made clear that the aforesaid direction to decide the petitioners' representation has been issued only with a view to ensure expeditious redressal of the petitioners' grievances, and

the same shall not be construed as a direction to decide the representation in a particular manner.

6. The stay petition and all pending applications, if any, also stand disposed of.
