1. The application for early listing of the matter is disposed of.
2. The instant writ petition has been filed on behalf of the petitioner seeking direction for the respondents to grant him regularization and pay-scale and all the attendant benefits from 27.05.2014.
3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that a Coordinate Bench of this Court vide order dated 16.02.2017 passed in a writ petition preferred by a similarly situated employee (Babulal Yadav vs. state of Raj. & Ors. in S.B. Civil Writ Petition No.6588/2013)

has directed the respondents to consider his representation in light of the judgments passed in the case of Ajeet Kumar Jain & 14 ors. Vs. State of Rajasthan & ors.: 2017(1) WLC (Raj.) UC 472 whereby the Division Bench of this Court, while relying upon the judgment in the case of Secretary, State of Karnataka & Ors. Vs. Umadevi (3) & ors: (2006) 4 SCC 1, therefore the present writ petition may also be decided with the same directions.

4. The prayer seems reasonable, accordingly the instant writ petition is disposed of with a direction to petitioner to prefer a representation agitating his grievance and aforementioned facts. The respondents are directed to consider the representation in terms of the judgment passed by the Apex Court in the case of Secretary, State of Karnataka & Ors. Vs. Umadevi (3) & ors (supra) and Ajeet Kumar Jain (supra) and decide it within a period of three months by passing a speaking order and if the petitioner is entitled for any relief strictly in accordance with law, the same shall be granted to me. However, independent of aforesaid consideration, the respondents are directed to give the petitioner the minimum of the pay-scale on the lowest grade in the regular pay scale extended to regular employees holding the same post in view of the judgment passed by the Apex Court in the case of State of Punjab and others Vs. Jagjit Singh and others: (2017) 1 SCC 148 w.e.f. the date of filing of this writ petition.

5. The writ petition stands disposed of with the directions/observations made herein above.
