Present writ petition has been filed praying for issuance of appropriate directions to respondent to grant NOC to petitioner for establishing new college for Branch of Physiotherapy (B.PT) course and also to permit Petitioner-College to admit students for the said course for academic year 2024-25.
2. This Court, vide order dated 26.11.2024, directed learned AAG, Mr. N.S. Rajpurohit, to place on record Inspection Report of petitioner-college. Since even after lapse of almost one year, reply along with Inspection Report had not been filed, Coordinate Bench of this Court again directed learned AAG to ensure compliance of order dated 26.11.2024 and granted further time on 20.11.2025, listing the matter on 06.12.2025. Thereafter, on 18.02.2026, learned AAG once again sought time to place Inspection Report on record. This Court noted that despite the specific order dated 26.11.2024, even after a lapse of more than one year and three months, directions issued by this Court had not been complied with. In view of such continued non-compliance, this Court

directed the Principal Secretary, Medical and Health Department, to remain present before this Court today at 2:00 PM.

3. Today, Ms. Gayatri Rathore, Principal Secretary, Medical and Health Department, appeared before this Court through video conferencing. On a specific query put by this Court regarding reasons for non-compliance of order dated 26.11.2024, no satisfactory explanation was offered by the Principal Secretary. It was merely stated that due to a communication gap, directions of this Court could not be complied with. It was further submitted that today the Inspection Report of petitioner-college has been placed on record along with the reply.

4. Even while passing earlier order dated 18.02.2026, this Court had specifically observed that present matter is not an isolated instance, and that in several other matters where similar directions have been issued for placing Inspection Reports on record, compliance has not been made by respondent-Department.

5. This Court is not satisfied with the explanation offered by the Principal Secretary, Medical and Health Department, regarding non-compliance of orders passed by this Court. For the last more than one and a half years, repeated assurances have been given that in future, directions passed by this Court would be complied with in a timely and responsible manner. However, in view of the assurance now extended by the Principal Secretary, this Court does not propose to take the issue of non-compliance any further at this stage. Nevertheless, it is expected from respondent-Department that such casual non-compliance of orders passed by this Court does not occur in future.

6. Learned counsel for the petitioner seeks time to make his submissions upon the Inspection Report filed on record today.
7. Time prayed for is allowed.
8. List the matter on 19.03.2026.
9. Further appearance of Principal Secretary is exempted at this stage.
