1. Heard learned counsel for the parties.
2. The present appeal has been filed against the interim order dated 12.08.2025 passed by the learned Single Bench in S.B. Civil Writ Petition No.8973/2025.
3. Learned counsel for the appellant without joining the issues on merit submits that the appellant may be given liberty to move an appropriate application under Article 226 (3) of the

Constitution of India for vacation of the interim order granted by the learned Single Bench. He further submits that since the interim order passed by the Co-ordinate Bench of this Court on 15.09.2025 is in currency for last more than six months, therefore, a breathing time may be granted to him to take the remedy available under the law. He, therefore, prays that the interim order passed by this Court may be continued for a limited period of 15 days.

4. Learned counsel for the respondents without joining the issues on merit has not objected to the submissions made by learned counsel for the appellant.

5. Considering the submissions made before this Court, the present special appeal(writ) is disposed of with a liberty to the appellant to file an appropriate application for vacation/modification of the interim order passed by the learned Single Bench and the interim order granted by this Court on 15.09.2025 shall remain in currency till 10.04.2026.

6. Needless to say that the application, if filed before the learned Single Bench, the same shall be decided expeditiously.

7. The respondents will be at liberty to raise all the objections against the application filed by the appellant under Article 226 (3) of the Constitution of India.
