1. By way of filing this writ petition, the petitioner has challenged the order dated 18.07.2025, whereby application for granting study leave/extraordinary leave submitted by the petitioner has been rejected.

2. At the outset, it has been admitted by learned counsel for the petitioner that as per Rule 32 of Central Civil Services (Leave) Rules, 1972 (for short 'the Rules of 1972'), any application for grant of study leave/extraordinary leave shall be submitted only after completion of three years of service, yet learned counsel for the petitioner sought indulgence of this Court upon Rule 65 of the Rules of 1972 to show that in appropriate cases, and after considering undue hardship in a particular case

the Ministry or Department has got power to relax or dispense with the requirements of any Rule.

3. Learned counsel for the respondents, on the contrary, submitted that petitioner is seeking study leave for pursuing PG medical course in the subject of Forensic Science, which is no longer required in CRPF department, and the rejection of leave application is strictly within the framework of Rules of 1972.

4. At this stage, it was also pointed out that no application whatsoever has been submitted by the petitioner after joining under Rule 65 of the Rules of 1972 for seeking appropriate relaxation as desired by the petitioner.

5. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that petitioner is ready to submit an application under Rule 65 for consideration of Competent Authority.

6. In view of above, this Court deems it just and proper to dispose of this writ petition with liberty to the petitioner to submit an application/representation under Rule 65 of the Rules of 1972 before Competent Authority, who shall consider and pass speaking order strictly in accordance with the Rules within a period of 15 days from the date of receipt of representation/application along with certified copy of this order.

7. Petitioner shall also be at liberty to approach this Court by way of filing fresh petition, in case, application under Rule 65 is decided against the petitioner.

8. Pending application(s), if any, stand(s) disposed of.
