1. The petitioner has preferred this bail application under Section 483 of BNSS in FIR No.165/2024 registered at Police Station Chitalwana, District Jalore for offence under Sections 8/18 and 8/22 of NDPS Act.
2. Heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned Public Prosecutor and perused the material available on record.
3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has falsely been implicated in this case. He further submits that nothing has been recovered from the conscious possession of the petitioner, and he has been implicated only on the basis of the disclosure statement of co-accused Mukesh, from whose possession 1.362 kg of opium milk and 115 grams of MD (Mephedrone), which are above commercial quantity, have been recovered. He argued that apart from that, there is nothing on record to connect or relate the petitioner to the alleged offence.

Therefore, the twin conditions under Section 37 are satisfied. The petitioner is behind bars since 13.06.2025 and has no criminal antecedents. The charge-sheet has been filed. The trial of the case will take considerable time, no fruitful purpose would be served by keeping the petitioner in further custody, hence, the bail application of the petitioner may be allowed.

4. Learned Public Prosecutor has vehemently opposed the bail application.

5. On consideration of the rival submissions and material available on record and in the light of submission made by learned counsel for the petitioner, but without expressing any opinion on merits/demerits of the case, I am inclined to grant benefit of bail to the petitioner.

6. Consequently, the bail application under Section 483 B.N.S.S. is allowed and it is directed that the petitioner **Ashok Kumar S/o Devaram**, be released on bail provided he furnishes a personal bond in the sum of Rs.50,000/- with two sureties in the sum of Rs.25,000/- each to the satisfaction of the learned trial court with the stipulation that he shall appear before that Court on all subsequent dates of hearing till conclusion of the trial.
