1. The petitioner has filed this bail application under Section 483 of BNSS in FIR No.31/2023 registered at Police Station Mohangarh, District Jaisalmer for offence under Sections 8/21, 29 of NDPS Act.
2. Heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned Public Prosecutor and perused the material available on record.
3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has falsely been implicated in this case. He further submits that the allegation against the petitioner is that on the successive disclosure of the co-accused, petitioner is designated as a supplier of the 525 gram Heroin which is above commercial quantity. He further argued that the prime accused Amar Lal from whose possession above contraband recovered has been enlarged on bail by a Coordinate Bench of this Court on 06.02.2026. The co-accused Kanwar Sain, Dinesh Kumar and Lokesh Kumar also got the benefit of bail on 13.12.2024 and 07.08.2024. He further

argued that similar situated co-accused Barkat Ali has been enlarged on bail by the trial Court itself on 22.12.2025. The case of the petitioner is on better footing from the co-accused. He again submits that the petitioner is behind the bars since 16.08.2023 with three cases of different nature. The trial of the case may take considerable time and no further custodial interrogation is required, hence on the ground of parity, the bail application of the petitioner may be allowed.

4. Learned Public Prosecutor has vehemently opposed the bail application.

5. On consideration of the rival submissions and material available on record and in the light of submission made by learned counsel for the petitioner especially on the ground of parity but without expressing any opinion on merits/demerits of the case, I am inclined to grant benefit of bail to the petitioner.

6. Consequently, the bail application under Section 483 B.N.S.S. is allowed and it is directed that the petitioner **Swaroop Singh S/o Shri Ransingh Singh @ Ram Singh**, be released on bail provided he furnishes a personal bond in the sum of Rs.50,000/- with two sureties in the sum of Rs.25,000/- each to the satisfaction of the learned trial court with the stipulation that he shall appear before that Court on all subsequent dates of hearing till conclusion of the trial.
