Order

1. Heard. Perused the material available on record.
2. The present parole writ petition has been filed by the petitioner-convict Joga Ram through his wife Smt. Ugiya Devi @ Ugali Devi Mali seeking his release on emergent parole for a period of 25 days on the ground that his wife is suffering from heart disease and the doctors advised for urgent CAG (surgery). The medical documents verifying the above fact are also annexed with this writ petition.
3. Shri Vishal Singh Bhati, Advocate representing the petitioner submits that the wife of petitioner is in need of urgent treatment and there is no other male member in the family of the petitioner

to look after his wife and make arrangement for her treatment. He thus prayed to release the petitioner-convict on emergent parole for a period of 25 days.

4. Today, learned Public Prosecutor has produced the report dated 09.11.2025 sent by the SHO, Police Station Shivpura which also reveals that the wife of the petitioner is not well.

5. In this view of the matter and keeping humanitarian ground to be of paramount consideration and there being no legal impediment to release the convict on emergent parole, this Court hereby direct that the convict-petitioner **Joga Ram S/o Bhana Ram** shall be released on emergent parole of twenty days (20 days) subject to the condition that he shall deposit a sum of **Rs.5,00,000/-** before the Superintendent, Central Jail concerned and provided he furnishes a personal bond in the sum of Rs.1,00,000/- and two sound, solvent and duly attested sureties of Rs.50,000/- each **(out of which one surety will be a close relative of the petitioner)** to the satisfaction of Superintendent, Central Jail concerned on the usual terms and conditions. The Superintendent, Central Jail, concerned shall be at liberty to impose other adequate and reasonable conditions to ensure return of convict to the custody after availing the parole. The term of parole shall be computed from the date of actual release of the convict.

6. If the petitioner surrenders within the stipulated period before the concerned Jail, then the amount of Rs.5,00,000/- so deposited before the Superintendent, Central Jail concerned shall be refunded back to him whereas if the petitioner fails to

surrender within the stipulated period, then the amount so deposited shall be forfeited immediately.

7. The parole writ petition is allowed accordingly.

8. Let this writ petition be again listed on 19.12.2025. Learned Public Prosecutor shall be required to submit the compliance report of the order as to whether the petitioner has surrendered or not
