1. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that in identical controversy being S.B. Civil Writ Petition No.12876/2025: Om Prakash Gurjar Vs. State of Rajasthan & Ors., decided on 28.08.2025, the Coordinate Bench of this Court at Jaipur has disposed of the writ petition as under:-

“1. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that during the recruitment process, petitioner has secured 186.5727 marks in MBS NCL category and while filing his preference in counseling, petitioner preferred Jaipur as his first district for posting.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner further submits that one circular dated 18.05.2020 was issued by the Administrative Reform Department for granting first posting to the candidates selected through RPSC, RSSB or any other recruiting agency and as per the

aforesaid circular, place of posting shall be assigned as per merit cum preference.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the persons lower in merit than the petitioner have although been assigned their home district, yet the petitioner despite giving his first preference, the same has not been considered and the petitioner has been posted at Sawaimadhopur.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioner also submits that similar controversy was considered by this Court in the case of Kindar Vs. State of Rajasthan & Ors. (S.B. Civil Writ Petition No. 6507/2017) decided on 04.08.2021.

5. In the light of above, the writ petition filed by the petitioner is disposed of with directions to the petitioner to make a representation in the light of aforesaid circular dated 18.05.2020 and order dated 04.08.2021 passed by this Court in Kindar Vs State of Rajasthan (supra). In case, the respondents find that the case of the petitioner is covered by the aforesaid circular and order dated 04.08.2021 passed by this Court, then appropriate order for modifying his place of posting may be passed within a period of four weeks from the date of submitting a representation along with certified copy of this order. It is made clear that this Court has not expressed any opinion on merits of the case."

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner, while not pressing the matter on merits at this stage, makes a limited submission that, in view of the identical nature of controversy involved in the present writ petition and the facts being materially similar to those in S.B. Civil Writ Petition No. 12876/2025 (Om Prakash Gurjar Vs. State of Rajasthan & Ors.), a similar order may be passed in the present case as well.

3. Thus, in view of the limited submissions made, the present writ petition is disposed of with a direction to to the petitioner to make a representation in the light of aforesaid circular dated 18.05.2020 and order dated 04.08.2021 passed by this Court in Kindar Vs State of Rajasthan (supra). In case, the respondents find that the case of the petitioner is covered by the aforesaid

circular and order dated 04.08.2021 passed by this Court, then appropriate order for modifying their place of posting may be passed within a period of four weeks from the date of submitting a representation along with certified copy of this order. It is made clear that this Court has not expressed any opinion on merits of the case.
