1. The petitioner has filed this bail application under Section 483 of BNSS in FIR No.147/2018 registered at Police Station Anadra, District Sirohi for offence under Sections 8/15 of NDPS Act and Section 420, 467, 468, 471 of IPC.
2. Heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned Public Prosecutor and perused the material available on record.
3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has falsely been implicated in this case. He further submits that as per the prosecution story, 119.300 Kg. Poppy-husk was recovered from an abandoned vehicle bearing No.GJ-01-RK-5283. The allegation against the petitioner is that he along with other co-accused Mukesh Kumar fled from the place of incident and arrested thereafter. He again submits that the similar situated co-accused Mukesh Kumar has been granted benefit of bail by a

Coordinate Bench of this Court on 20.10.2023 and another co-accused Mahendra also got the benefit of bail on 06.01.2022. He again submits that the petitioner is behind the bars since 24.01.2025 without any criminal past. The trial of the case may take considerable time and no further custodial interrogation is required, hence on the ground of parity, the bail application of the petitioner may be allowed.

4. Learned Public Prosecutor has vehemently opposed the bail application.

5. On consideration of the rival submissions and material available on record and in the light of submission made by learned counsel for the petitioner especially on the ground of parity but without expressing any opinion on merits/demerits of the case, I am inclined to grant benefit of bail to the petitioner.

6. Consequently, the bail application under Section 483 B.N.S.S. is allowed and it is directed that the petitioner **Prakash @ PP S/o Shri Rugaram**, be released on bail provided he furnishes a personal bond in the sum of Rs.50,000/- with two sureties in the sum of Rs.25,000/- each to the satisfaction of the learned trial court with the stipulation that he shall appear before that Court on all subsequent dates of hearing till conclusion of the trial.
