1. The present bail application has been filed by the accused-applicant under Section 483 of the B.N.S.S., 2023 against the order dated 14.10.2025 passed by learned Additional Sessions Judge, Sanchore, District Jalore in Bail Application No.604/2025 arising out of FIR No.255/2025, registered at Police Station Sanchore, District Jalore for the offences punishable under Sections 80(2), 85, 238(a) read with 103(1) of BNS, 2023 by which the bail application of the accused-applicant under Section 483 of the B.N.S.S., 2023 has been dismissed.
2. Learned counsel for the accused-applicant submits that the accused-applicant, who is the father-in-law of the deceased, has been falsely implicated in the present case. Learned counsel further submits that there is no evidence on record to show that the deceased was subjected to cruelty with regard to any demand for dowry. It is further submitted that the present case does not

pertain to dowry, as the daughter of the accused-applicant is married to the brother of the deceased. Learned counsel further submits that the deceased committed suicide and the parents of the deceased were duly informed by the accused. The funeral was conducted in the presence of members of both families. It is also submitted that the FIR was lodged after a delay of almost five days, and that too upon legal advice.

3. Learned counsel for the accused-applicant contends that the accused-applicant was arrested on 01.06.2025 and since then, he is behind the bars. Learned counsel also contends that the charge-sheet has already been filed and trial will take long time to conclude, therefore, the accused-applicant be granted benefit of bail.

4. Learned Public Prosecutor vehemently opposes the bail application.

5. Heard learned counsel for the parties and also perused the material available on record.

6. Considering the overall facts and circumstances of the case, looking to the fact that the accused-applicant was arrested on 01.06.2025 and since then he is behind the bars and that the charge-sheet has been filed and trial will take long time to conclude, without expressing any opinion on the merits/demerits of the case, this Court deems it proper to allow the bail application filed by the applicant.

7. Consequently, this bail application filed under Section 483 of the B.N.S.S., 2023 is allowed. It is ordered that accused-applicant **Heeraram S/o Bhema Ram**, arrested in connection with FIR

No.255/2025, registered at Police Station Sanchore, District Jalore shall be released on bail; provided he furnishes personal bond in the sum of Rs.50,000/- and two solvent attested sureties of Rs.25,000/- each to the satisfaction of the trial Court.

8. Applicant shall be required to appear before that Court on all dates of hearing and as and when called upon to do so.
