1. The petitioner has preferred this bail application under Section 483 of BNSS in FIR No.223/2022 registered at Police Station Goluwala, District Hanumangarh for offences under Section 8/22 of NDPS Act.
2. Heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned Public Prosecutor and perused the material available on record.
3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has falsely been implicated in this case. He further submits that as per the prosecution story 3.850 Kilograms of Tramadol, which is above the commercial quantity is alleged to have been recovered from the joint possession of petitioner and other co-accused Balwinder Singh, Saminder Singh and Ashok Kumar from vehicle No. HR-31J-0377. He argued that similarly situated co-accused Saminder Singh has been granted bail by

Co-ordinate Bench of this Court on 18.09.2025 and Ashok Kumar on 25.09.2025. His further contention is that case of the present petitioner is akin to that of other co-accused who have been enlarged on bail. Though, one case of different nature has been reported against the petitioner, but in that case, he has been bailed out. The petitioner is behind the bars since 11.08.2022, and the trial of the case will take considerable time, hence, no fruitful purpose would be served by keeping the petitioner in further custody, hence, on the ground of parity, the bail application of the petitioner may be allowed.

4. Learned Public Prosecutor has vehemently opposed the bail application.

5. On consideration of the rival submissions and material available on record and in the light of submission made by learned counsel for the petitioner, especially on the ground of parity, but without expressing any opinion on merits/demerits of the case, I am inclined to grant benefit of bail to the petitioner.

6. Consequently, the bail application under Section 483 B.N.S.S. is allowed and it is directed that the petitioner **Sandeep Kumar S/o Shyopat Ram**, be released on bail provided he furnishes a personal bond in the sum of Rs.50,000/- with two sureties in the sum of Rs.25,000/- each to the satisfaction of the learned trial court with the stipulation that he shall appear before that Court on all subsequent dates of hearing till conclusion of the trial.
