1. The instant bail application has been filed under Section 483 BNSS on behalf of accused-petitioner. The petitioner has been arrested in connection with FIR No.184/2017 registered at Police Station Rayla, District Bhilwara for the offence(s) under Sections 8/15, 8/25 & 8/29 of NDPS Act.

2. Learned counsel for the accused-petitioner submits that the accused-petitioner has falsely been implicated in the present case case. It is further contended that petitioner lodged an FIR regarding theft of vehicle bearing registration No. RJ-19-UC-0940 in Police Station Sastri Nagar, Jodhpur on 22.11.2017 at 04:53 P.M. It is also contended that the petitioner appeared before the Police Station on 22.11.2017 in the morning and an entry was made in daily diary at 12:15 P.M. on the same date, which is substantiated by the '*rojnamcha*' report. It is argued that the

same vehicle was recovered from Rayla Police Station, District Bhilwara at the same day. It is also argued that previously a final report was submitted and investigation was kept pending, however, thereafter the police has arrested the present petitioner. The accused-petitioner is behind the bars since 02.11.2025 and further trial of the case may take considerable time, therefore, the bail application of the petitioner may be allowed.

3. Learned Public Prosecutor has vehemently opposed the bail application.

4. Heard and perused the material available on record.

5. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case including the fact that petitioner is behind the bars since 02.11.2025 and further trial of the case may take considerable time, therefore, without expressing anything on the merits of the case, I deem it just and proper to enlarge the accused-petitioner on bail.

6. Accordingly, the bail application under Section 483 BNSS is allowed and it is ordered that the accused-petitioner **Ashok Kumar S/o Mohan Lal Vishnoi**, in connection with FIR No.184/2017 registered at Police Station Rayla, District Bhilwara shall be enlarged on bail provided he furnishes a personal bond in the sum of Rs.50,000/- with two sureties of Rs.25,000/- each to the satisfaction of the learned trial Judge for his appearance before the court concerned on all the dates of hearing and as and when called upon to do so.
