1. Heard on the interim stay application.
2. The learned counsel appearing for the petitioner submits that
the petitioner had been working with the respondents as an
Assistant Professor for more than the last 18 years on a

temporary basis. The petitioner filed a writ petition (No.11834/2023) seeking regularization of her services with the respondents. The said writ petition was filed by the petitioner in the year 2023 and the same is still pending consideration before this Court.

3. The case of the petitioner is that in order to overcome the regularization of her services, the respondents have resorted to terminating the services of the petitioner by the impugned order dated 29.10.2025 (Annex.1).The impugned order reflects that one month's salary in advance in lieu of notice will be paid to the petitioner. According to the learned counsel for the petitioner, the present impugned order has been passed with ulterior motives.

4. Considering the length of the services rendered by the petitioner and the circumstances in which the petitioner had filed the above said writ petition seeking regularization, this Court finds that the present impugned order terminating the services of the petitioner appears to have been passed with ill-motives. In such circumstances, the respondents are directed to continue with the services of the petitioner till pendency of the present writ petition.

5. Admit. Issue notice, returnable within a period of four weeks.
