Order

- This contempt petition has been filed by the petitioner alleging non-compliance of the order dated 03.09.2024.
- By the order dated 03.09.2024, the Court observed as under:-

"41. Accordingly, the instant petition stands allowed. The respondents are directed to release family pension of the petitioner and legitimate children of the

deceased pensioner as per provisions of Rules of 1996, with all arrears of pension with interest @9% per annum w.e.f. the date it became due till its payment, without pressing upon furnishing of succession certificate.

42. It goes without saying that needful exercise would be done by the respondents within a period of two months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order."

3. Learned Additional Advocate General appearing for the respondents submits that due compliance of the orders of the Court has been made.

4. Learned counsel appearing for the petitioner also submits that the due payment of the family pension has been made to the petitioner in the months of December-2024 and February-2025. He also submits that the respondents have paid the amount of Rs.11,59,313/- towards the interest amount as ordered by the Court. He submits that the respondents have paid the amount of interest by a delay of 20 months.

5. As per the order of the Court passed in the writ petition, the petitioner was entitled for arrears of the family pension and so also the interest @9% on the arrears. There is no order regarding any interest on the amount paid towards the interest. This Court also finds that the due payment of arrears have been made to the petitioner way back in February-2025 and after making calculation of the due payment, the respondent authority has made the payment of interest amount also.

6. In opinion of the Court, the substantial compliance of the order of the Court has been made by the respondents. Therefore this contempt petition is disposed off.

7. Pending application/s, if any, also stand/s disposed.



8. Contempt notice/s stand/s discharged.
