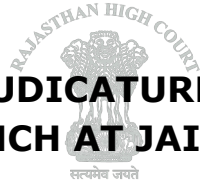


**HIGH COURT OF JUDICATURE FOR RAJASTHAN

1. The present writ petition has been filed assailing the order dated 19.05.2025, passed by learned Civil Judge-cum-Judicial Magistrate No.2 Alwar, whereby evidence of the plaintiff has been closed and thereafter, application for recalling the said order was decided vide order dated 01.12.2025, passed by learned Civil Judge-cum-Judicial Magistrate No.2 Alwar, wherein the application seeking permission to lead evidence was dismissed.
2. Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that one last opportunity may be granted to them to adduce their entire evidence, and that they are ready and willing to pay costs.

3. Though this Court finds that thirty-two opportunities had already been granted to the plaintiffs-petitioners to adduce evidence and they failed to do so, in the interest of justice, one last opportunity is granted to the plaintiffs to adduce their entire evidence, subject to payment of costs of Rs. 25,000/- to the defendant-respondent.

4. Learned trial Court shall grant the plaintiffs-petitioners only one final opportunity to lead their entire evidence, subject to payment of costs of Rs. 25,000/- in advance to the defendant.

5. If the respondent is aggrieved by this order in any manner, he shall be at liberty to approach this Court by way of filing a recall application.

6. With the above observation, the present writ petition stands disposed of.

7. Pending application(s), if any, stand disposed of.
