Issue notices to the respondents.

Mr. Prateek Saksena, Advocate with Mr. Ashutosh Udawat, Advocate, appearing on behalf of Mr. Kapil Prakash Mathur, learned Additional Advocate General, accept notice on behalf of respondents No.1, 10 and 14.

Mr. V.D. Gathala, learned Assistant Government Counsel, accepts notices on behalf of respondents No.11 and 12.

Learned counsel for the petitioner is directed to serve a copy of petition in the Offices of Mr. Kapil Prakash Mathur, learned AAG and Mr. V.D. Gathala, learned AGC.

Notices be filed for other respondents, returnable within four weeks. Notices may also be sent through registered post in addition to normal process.

Notices also be given *dasti* to learned counsel for the petitioner.

Learned counsel for the respondents seek four weeks' time to file reply.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that despite having a residential *patta* issued in favour of the petitioner by Gram Panchayat Kotri Dhaylan, the respondents have demolished a part of the construction raised by the petitioner and are further bent upon to dispossess her.

Learned counsel also submits that the impugned notice dated 15.01.2026 has been issued in the name of one Nathuram Bhargav, who is the husband of the petitioner who has expired as back as on 02.02.2010, for which even a death certificate has been issued by Nagar Palika, however, despite this fact the impugned notice has been issued in the name of a deceased person.

Learned counsel has further placed reliance upon similar order passed in the case of **Bajrang Lal Vs. State of Rajasthan and Others** in **S.B. Civil Writ Petition No.1398/2026** dated 31.01.2026.

Taking note of the above, the respondents are directed to not to dispossess the petitioner from her residential house situated as mentioned in *patta* No.15 dated 05.06.2017 (Annexure 1).

It is clarified that the respondents are restrained to not to take any action only to the extent of *patta* of the petitioner and they are free to proceed ahead with respect to area beyond the *patta* of the petitioner. Also, learned counsel for the respondent would be at liberty to move an application seeking modification/vacation of the order, if so advised.
