Issue notice to the respondents.

Mr. Rahul Tiwari, Advocate, appears on caveat on behalf of respondent No. 1/1/2 - Mr. Ramesh and under instructions accepts notice on behalf of respondents No. 1/1/1, 1/1/3 and 1/1/4.

Mr. V.D. Gathala, learned AGC, puts in appearance on behalf of respondent No.2.

Hence, service stands complete. Notice need not be filed.

Learned counsel for the petitioner is also directed to serve a copy of the writ petition in the Office of Mr. V.D. Gathala, learned AGC.

At the very outset, a query was put up by the Court to the learned counsel for the petitioner as to whether in light of Section 230 of the Rajasthan Tenancy Act, 1955 (hereinafter referred to as '**the Act of 1955**'), the revision petition filed before the learned Board of Revenue, Ajmer, against the interim order dated

09.06.2025 passed by the learned Sub-Divisional Officer, Sambhar Lake, was maintainable or not.

In this regard, reference was made to the orders passed by Co-ordinate Bench in the case of **Lala Versus Krishna Kumar Verma and Ors.** reported in **2025 SCC OnLine Raj 7068** and at Principal Bench, Jodhpur in the case of **N.T.P.C. Renewable Energy Versus The Board of Revenue, Ajmer and Ors.** reported in **2025 SCC OnLine Raj 7091**, wherein it has been held in unequivocal terms that a revision petition under Section 230 of the Act of 1955 lies only against a final order and not against an interim order.

Learned counsel for the petitioner, however, submits that in addition to challenging the order dated 04.03.2026 passed by the learned BOR, he has also challenged the order dated 09.06.2025 passed by the learned SDO, Sambhar Lake.

He further submits that the matter be tagged along with S.B. Civil Writ Petition No. 7192/2016.

Learned counsel for the respondents prays for and is granted six weeks' time to file reply to the writ petition.

List the matter along with S.B. Civil Writ Petition No. 7192/2016.
