1. Heard on the interim stay application.
2. The learned counsel appearing for the petitioners submits that the petitioners are engaged by the respondents to work as Domain Experts and Junior Domain Experts on a fixed remuneration under the project sponsored by the State Government. It is the contention of the learned counsel appearing for the petitioners that though the project is continued and there is no discontinuation of the protect, their services are sought to be discontinued when they demanded the just wages.
3. It is also submitted that in a similar set of facts, this Court has granted interim protection on the discontinuation of services of the petitioner in S.B. Civil Writ Petition No. **3860/2026** titled as "**Nasir Husain Multani Vs. State of Rajasthan**".
3. In the said circumstances, the respondents are directed not to discontinue the services of the petitioners till further orders or as long as the project is continued, whichever is earlier.
4. Issue notice to the respondents, returnable within a period of four weeks.
5. List the matter on **11.05.2026**.
