1. The instant bail application has been filed on behalf of the accused-petitioner under Section 483 of BNSS in connection with FIR No. 12/2022 registered at Police Station Renwal, District Jaipur Rural for the offence(s) punishable under Sections 420, 406 & 120B of IPC.
2. Learned counsel for the accused-petitioner submits that the accused-petitioner has been falsely implicated in this case; charge-sheet has already been filed. He also submits that the accused-petitioner is in custody since 26.02.2026. He further submits that the complainant has been examined and during the Court trial no incriminatory statement against the accused-petitioner has been stated. He further submits that a compromise has been arrived at, between the parties and the alleged offences

against the accused-petitioner are triable by Magistrate; conclusion of trial will take its own time, so no fruitful purpose would be served by keeping the accused-petitioner behind the bars and, therefore, prays that the accused-petitioner may be granted the benefit of bail under Section 483 of BNSS.

3. *Per contra*, learned Public Prosecutor vehemently opposes the submissions made by learned counsel for the accused-petitioner hereinabove and submits that there are criminal antecedents registered against the accused-petitioner. Learned counsel for the complainant concurs with the fact that an amicable settlement has been arrived at, between the parties and he has no objection regarding this bail application.

4. Having regard to the totality of the facts and circumstances of the case and considering the arguments advanced by learned counsel for both the parties; that charge-sheet has already been filed; that the accused-petitioner is in custody since 26.02.2026; that the present offences are triable by Magistrate; trial will take its own time. Hence, this Court without expressing any opinion on the merits/demerits of the case, deems it just and proper to enlarge the accused-petitioners on bail.

5. Therefore, the instant bail application under Section 483 BNSS is accordingly, **allowed** and the accused-petitioner **Anil Kumar S/o Shankarlal Birla** is ordered to be released on bail, provided he furnishes a personal bond in the sum of Rs. 1,00,000/- with two sureties of Rs. 50,000/- each to the satisfaction of the Trial Court, with the stipulation that he shall appear before that Court and any Court to which the matter is

transferred, on all subsequent dates of hearing and as and when called upon to do so.

6. It is made clear that the accused-petitioner shall not involve in any other offence(s) during currency of the bail.

7. In case of any breach of the aforementioned conditions, the learned Public Prosecutor shall be free to move the application against the accused-petitioner for cancellation of the bail before the concerned Court.

8. The observation made hereinabove is only for decision of the instant bail application and would not have any impact on the trial of the case in any manner.
