1. The present writ petition has been filed by the petitioner
challenging the action of the respondents of not giving her
appointment on the post of Teacher Level-I at her allotted school
i.e. Govt. Sr. Secondary School Dhansia, Block Nohar, District
Hanumangarh.
2. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that pursuant to
the Advertisement No.12/2022 dated 16.12.2022, the petitioner

appeared in the examination on 25.02.2023 and she was selected in the final merit list for appointment vide order dated 13.08.2023, however, subsequently an FIR bearing No.148/2024 came to be registered against the petitioner and her family members on 02.07.2024 for the offences punishable under Sections 115(2), 126(2), 329(3), 352, 190, 191(2), 191(3), 118(1), 117(2) of BNS. Learned counsel further submits that the petitioner was issued appointment order dated 11.02.2026 and there was no concealment of fact.

3. Learned counsel submits that she has been falsely implicated in the case in respect to the land, which they are sharing with the complainant. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has no role in the alleged offence and all the family members have been falsely implicated.

4. Learned counsel further submits that in a similar case the Co-ordinate Bench of this Court in **SBCWP No.4208/2021** titled as **Ramniwas Vs. State of Rajasthan** dated 07.05.2024, considering the pendency of the criminal case ordered for appointment of the concerned person, but directed that the same shall remain subject to final outcome of the writ petition.

5. In view of the above, let notices be issued, returnable within four weeks.

6. In the meantime, the respondents are directed to give appointment to the petitioner on provisional basis but the same shall remain subject to final outcome of the present writ petition.
