1. These bail applications have been filed on behalf of the accused-petitioners under Section 483 of BNSS in connection with FIR No. 68/2026 registered at Police Station Singhana, District Jhunjhunu for the offence(s) under Section 318(4) of BNS, under Sections 3 & 4 of Prize Chits and Money Circulation Schemes (Banning) Act, 1978, under Sections 3, 5, 21 & 23 of The Unregulated Deposit Schemes (Banning) Act, 2019 and under Section 66D of IT Act, in which charge-sheet has been submitted under Sections 3 & 4 of Prize Chits and Money Circulation Schemes (Banning) Act, 1978 and under Sections 3, 5, 21 & 23 of The Unregulated Deposit Schemes (Banning) Act, 2019.

2. Learned counsel for the accused-petitioners submits that the accused-petitioners have been falsely implicated in this case. He further submits that accused-petitioners are behind the bars since 16.03.2026; charge-sheet has already been filed; there are no criminal antecedents against the accused-petitioners; conclusion of trial will take its own time, and no fruitful purpose would be served by keeping the petitioners behind the bars and, therefore, prays that the accused-petitioners may be granted the benefit of bail under Section 483 of BNSS.

3. *Per contra*, learned Public Prosecutor vehemently opposes the bail applications.

4. Having regard to the totality of the facts and circumstances of the case and considering the fact that charge-sheet has already been filed; that accused-petitioners are behind the bars since 16.03.2026; that there are no criminal antecedents against the accused-petitioners; trial will take its own time. Hence, this Court without expressing any opinion on the merits/demerits of the case, deems it just and proper to enlarge the accused-petitioners on bail.

5. Therefore, these bail applications under Section 483 BNSS are accordingly, **allowed** and the accused-petitioners **Rakesh Kumar S/o Girdharilal, Khyaliram S/o Bhataram, Mukesh Kumar S/o Omprakash, Ganga Prasad S/o Sitaram and Narendra Kumar S/o Late Shyoram** are ordered to be released on bail, provided each of them furnishes a personal bond in the sum of Rs. 1,00,000/- with two sureties of Rs. 50,000/- each to the satisfaction of the trial Court, with the stipulation that they shall appear before that Court and any court to which the matter

is transferred, on all subsequent dates of hearing and as and when called upon to do so.

6. It is made clear that the accused-petitioners shall not involve themselves in any offence(s) during currency of the bail.

7. In case of any breach of the aforementioned condition, the learned Public Prosecutor shall be free to move the application against the accused-petitioners for cancellation of the bail before the concerned Court.

8. The observation made hereinabove is only for decision of the instant bail applications and would not have any impact on the trial of the case in any manner.
