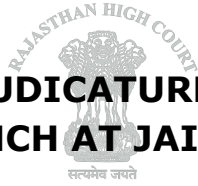

HON'BLE MR. JUSTICE ANUROOP SINGHI

Order

05/05/2026

1. The present criminal miscellaneous petitions have been filed by the petitioners seeking quashing of the FIR No.0018/2026 dated 24.03.2026, lodged at Special Police Station SOG, ATS & SOG, for the alleged offences punishable under Sections 420, 467, 468, 471 and 120-B of Indian Penal Code, 1860.
2. Learned counsel for the petitioners submit that the allegations in the impugned FIR pre-dominantly pertain to the extent and percentage of disability of the petitioners, so as to determine their entitlement with respect to recruitment in public employment.
3. Learned counsel further submit that the disability certificates have been issued to them by the competent authorities after due consideration of all relevant aspects, and the sole basis on which the impugned FIR has been registered is the difference in the percentage of disability, for which, the petitioners have no role and the same can at best be attributed to a difference of opinion.
4. Learned counsel, at the very outset, have also relied upon the interim order passed by this Court at Principal Seat, Jodhpur on 09.04.2026 in ***S.B. Criminal Miscellaneous (Petition) No.2596/2026*** titled as ***Mohit Singh and Another Vs. State of Rajasthan and Another*** along with other connected matters, wherein this Court while directing the learned Public Prosecutor to call the Investigating Officer along with the case dairy also directed that the petitioners shall not be arrested in connection with the impugned FIR being FIR No.18/2026 registered at Special Police Station SOG, ATS & SOG.

5. Learned counsel submit that the said interim order is still in force and operative as on date, and the case of the petitioners is similarly situated to the petitioners in the said matters.

6. Learned counsel have also relied upon the subsequent order dated 17.04.2026 passed in those petitions, wherein the controversy has been dealt with at length and the interim order has been extended.

7. Learned counsel also submit that even in civil writ petitions filed by few of the petitioners, interim relief has already been granted by the Court, directing that no coercive action be taken against the petitioners by the State Authorities in respect of their public employment.

8. Taking note of the same, issue notices to the respondents.

9. Mr. Manvendra Singh Shekhawat, learned Public Prosecutor, appears on behalf of respondent No.1.

10. Notice be filed only for respondent No.2, returnable within four weeks. Notice may also be sent through registered post in addition to normal process.

However, notice need not be filed in S.B. Criminal Miscellaneous Petition No.2309/2026 as the service upon sole respondent is complete.

11. Learned Public Prosecutor is directed to call for the case dairy and to also ensure the presence of Investigating Officer on the next date of hearing.

12. List these matters on 16.07.2026.

13. In the meanwhile, the petitioners shall not be arrested in connection with the FIR No.0018/2026 dated 24.03.2026, lodged at Special Police Station SOG, ATS & SOG.
