1. This instant application under Section 483 of BNSS is filed by the petitioner-applicant **Ramesh Bishnoi S/o Shri Raghunath Bishnoi** for seeking bail in connection with FIR No. 10/2026 dated 30.03.2026 registered at P.S. Central Bureau of Narcotics, Bani Park, District -Jaipur for alleged offence under Sections 8/18 & 29 of NDPS Act.
2. Learned counsel for the applicant submits that the applicant has falsely been implicated in a concocted criminal case. She also submitted that CBN has not complied mandatory provisions under the law at the time of search and no opportunity is provided to be searched in presence of Magistrate.

3. Learned counsel for petitioner submits that the present petitioner was arrested on 31.03.2026 with Ajay Singh Yogi and a Co-ordinate Bench of this Hon'ble Court has already granted bail to Ajay Singh Yogi. She further submitted that alleged recovery of 1.189 kg of opium was made in the instant case and recovered quantity is less than commercial quantity. She also submitted that except one case under IPC, no other criminal case is pending against the petitioner.
4. Learned Special Public Prosecutor has opposed the bail application and submitted that the allegations against the petitioner are grave and serious.
5. Heard learned counsel for the petitioner-applicant and learned Special Public Prosecutor. Perused the material available on record submitted by both the parties.
6. On 30.03.2026 a motor cycle no. RJ29 KS 9020 driven by Ajay was intercepted by Central Narcotics Bureau (CBN). The present petitioner was sitting as pillion rider and on search 1.189 kg of opium from two plastic pouches, from a backpack was recovered. A case no. 10/2026 under Section 8/18 & 29 of NDPS Act was registered. The present petitioner was arrested on 31.03.2026 and he is in custody. Co-accused Ajay Singh Yogi was already released on bail by a Co-ordinate Bench of this Court on 10.04.2026.
7. The material on record indicate that as per statement under Section 67 the opium was purchased by Ramesh Bishnoi himself and same is also recovered from backpack in possession of present petitioner. The recovered quantity is less than commercial quantity and same is intermediate

quantity. One case under IPC was registered against the petitioner and Co-accused was already granted bail on the ground that recovery is not effected from him.

8. Having considered the police report and the material placed on record for perusal, the matter is still at the investigation stage, but the investigation so far indicates that the petitioner-applicant is not required for further investigation. The trial will take time, thus, without expressing any opinion on role of the present petitioner-applicant, it is appropriate to grant bail to the petitioner accused.
9. Thus, the instant bail application filed on behalf of applicant-accused **Ramesh Bishnoi S/o Shri Raghunath Bishnoi**, is hereby allowed and the applicant-accused is ordered to be released on bail upon furnishing a personal bond of ₹50,000/- with two sureties of like amount to the satisfaction of the Trial Court with the following conditions:-
 - (i) The applicant-accused shall not tamper with evidence or influence the witness in any manner.
 - (ii) The applicant-accused shall not indulge in any criminal activity and shall not repeat any criminal offence punishable under the Law.
 - (iii) The applicant-accused shall attend the hearing of the Trial Court on the date fixed by the Trial court or as and when asked to appear before the Trial Court.
 - (iv) In case of any violation of above conditions, the bail granted to the applicant-accused shall be liable to be canceled.

10. The Registry is directed to send a copy of this order to the Trial Court through E-mail.
