1. This contempt petition has been filed by the petitioners alleging non-compliance of the order dated 19.03.2026.

2. Vide interim order dated 19.03.2026, the respondents were directed to continue the petitioners in service.
3. On 14.08.2026, when the case was listed before this Court, learned counsel for the petitioners submitted that though the respondents have continued the petitioners in service, however, they have not paid remunerations.
4. Today, the learned counsel appearing for the respondent has placed before this Court the letters give to both the petitioners by the Medical Officer Incharge stating therein that there are no dues of salaries to be paid to them.
5. The letters submitted by the learned counsel for the respondents are taken on record.
6. In view of the submission made by the learned counsel for the petitioners that the petitioners are continued in service and are being paid their remuneration, this Court is of the opinion that the respondents have substantially complied with the order of the Court.
7. Accordingly, this contempt petition stands disposed of.
8. Contempt notices stand discharged.
