1. The present writ petition has been filed against the order dated 24.02.2026 (Annexure-4) passed by the learned Board of Revenue, Rajasthan, Ajmer (**BOR**) in Revision/T.A./1751/2026/District-Jhunjhunu titled as Jagram & Ors. Versus Daluram & Ors., vide which while declining to entertain the appeal filed against the order dated 13.02.2026 passed by the Revenue Appellate Authority (**RAA**), Sikar, on the ground of the same being not maintainable, in the same breath, the judgment and decree dated 23.12.2025 passed by the Sub-Divisional Officer (**SDO**), Chirawa, District Jhunjhunu, has been stayed for a period of one month from the date of passing of the order.

2. Mr. Tapeswar Pal Singh Parmar, learned counsel for the petitioner, submits that once the learned BOR has declined to entertain the appeal on the ground of the same being not maintainable, it was not at all open for it to pass an interim order, so as to stay the effect and operation of the judgment and decree dated 23.12.2025 passed by the SDO, Chirawa.

3. Learned counsel further submits that though the interim order was confined to a period of one month, however, on account of the said order being passed, the subordinate authorities are not at all proceeding with the order.

4. Taking note of the above, issue notice to the respondents, returnable within six weeks, both by ordinary process as well as registered process.

5. Notices be given *dasti* as well to the learned counsel for the petitioner.
6. List the matter on 10.07.2026.
7. In the meanwhile and till further order, the effect and operation of the order dated 24.02.2026 (Annexure-4) passed by the learned Board of Revenue, Rajasthan, Ajmer, in Revision/T.A./1751/2026/District-Jhunjhunu shall remain stayed.
